INFORMATION FOR PARENTS



IF YOUR FAMILY LIVES IN ANY OF THE FOLLOWING SITUATIONS:

In a shelter

In a motel or campground due to the lack of an alternative adequate accommodation

In a car, park, abandoned building, or bus or train station

Doubled up with other people due to loss of housing or economic hardship

Your school-age children may qualify for certain rights and protections under the federal McKinney-Vento Act.

Your eligible children have the right to:

- · Receive a free, appropriate public education.
- Enroll in school immediately, even if lacking documents normally required for enrollment.
- Enroll in school and attend classes while the school gathers needed documents.
- Enroll in the local school; or continue attending their school of origin (the school they attended when permanently housed or the school in which they were last enrolled), if that is your preference and is feasible.
 - * If the school district believes that the school you select is not in the best interest of your children, then the district must provide you with a written explanation of its position and inform you of your right to appeal its decision.
- · Receive transportation to and from the school of origin, if you request this.
- Receive educational services comparable to those provided to other students, according to your children's needs.

If you believe your children may be eligible, contact the local liaison to find out what services and supports may be available. There also may be supports available for your preschool-age children.




Creativity Festival

Students design iPOD amplification system

Be prepared for fall sports

Be prepared for the next school year

As the anticipation for the first day of kindergarten, junior high or college builds for our children, parents can help to make sure they are ready. Children entering kindergarten, seventh grade, and post-secondary institutions have immunization requirements that must be met before classes start. These requirements are part of Minnesota's School Immunization Law. To get a copy of your child's immunization record or if you have questions regarding what vaccines your child needs, please call me at the school or at CHI LakeWood Health. If you have concerns regarding the cost of vaccines, please check with your healthcare provider or public health to see if your child is eligible to receive immunizations at a reduced cost through the Minnesota Vaccines for Children Program.

Finally, a reminder that if your child needs to have medication administered during the school day, an authorization form needs to be signed by you and your medical provider. Medication needs to be in its original container. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to contact me during the school year at Lake of the Woods School, Monday through Friday between the hours of 8:00 am and 3:00 pm or at CHI LakeWood Health.

What is the difference between School Readiness and ECFE classes?

School Readiness is our weekly school classes for 3-5 year olds. The number of days a week for classes are determined by enrollment numbers, and funds. Each school year schedule can vary depending on these two factors.



Bear's Den Visit

In late November, DNR Wildlife Manager, Gretchen Mehmel, while conducting surveys in an old growth forest area east of Norris camp, discovered an active hibernating bear den site. She contacted "advance telemetry systems" ((ATS) personnel, who graciously donated a telemetry neck collar to place on the bear to monitor its habits and become part of an on-going DNR research project.

On February 8th, one of the coldest days of the winter, DNR researchers Dave Garshalis and Andy Tri, along with students from Lake of the Woods School Community Education "Outdoor Club" and other DNR personnel tranquillized an adult female (weight# 140 pounds) and her yearling male cub (#32 pounds.) Outdoor Club members assisted researchers in obtaining pertinent information on the bears, including weight, hair samples (DNA) body fat, and general overall condition. The adult female was fitted with a telemetry collar, and both bears were given ear tags. DNR researchers gave the students a wealth of information on bear biology.


Andy Pierson (Outdoor Club advisor) and 3rd grade teacher at L/W school along with his 3rd grade class will "adopt" these research bears into their classroom studies and follow their movements and habits with ongoing updates throughout the school year.

Lake of the Woods 3rd graders visited Mr. Jeff Birchem and Mrs. Gretchen Birchem at Norris Camp on Friday, March 17th. In class, students have been preparing to create their own Lake of the Woods Environmental Blog. Blogs are meant to be both informational and fun to read for the general public. So, our 3rd graders have prepared interview questions for wildlife experts Jeff and Gretchen, to learn more about the wildlife in our area. We began the day with a nature hike to the bears den. We also listed carefully to Gretchen's bear transmitter to see if the bear was walking around before we headed to its den. Walking quietly into the woods, every student got a glimpse of the bear in hibernation! Along the way, students were able to make observations of the pileated woodpecker holes in several trees and even came across a ruffed grouse winter hiding spot marked by several droppings. . Then, we toured several buildings in the Norris CCC Camp where the workers slept and showered. During our lunch cookout, our 3rd graders were able to conduct their interviews to learn more about the amazing work that Jeff and Gretchen do around the camp!

3rd Graders Ella Johnson, Shalee Neumiller, Dominic Anthony, Will Tange, Dominik Washburn, Andy Higgins, and Kendal Bowman observe fish scales under the microscope to determine the age of several species of fish. Like a tree, scales show rings that indicate periods of growth. Rings that are farther apart occur when the fish grows well and there is lots of food - in the summer season. Rings that are close together occur when the fish does not get much food and grows slowly - in the winter season. Using this information, our Enrichment students observed walleye, sauger, perch, crappie, and tulipe scales to determine their ages!
