Many young people leave their homes due to abuse, neglect, and family conflict. Children and youth who have lost their housing live in a variety of places including motels, shelters, shared residences, transitional housing programs, cars, campgrounds, and others, Their lack of permanent housing can lead to potentially serious physical, emotional, and mental consequences. The Lake of the Woods School will ensure that all children and youth receive a free and appropriate public education and are given meaningful opportunities to succeed in our school. The Lake of the Woods School will follow the requirements of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act. Eligible students will receive support and referrals to outside school resources as needed.

We ask that parents and guardians complete this Questionnaire at the time of admissions. We ask that parents update this form as situations change that may make a student eligible under this act.
