Thanks to additional money available through the Esser Grant, Lake of the Woods Athletics & Activities will be free of charge for students in grades 7-12.

Shena Brandt, Lake of the Woods School Business Manager, worked to find ways to spend the allotted Esser Grant money, and discovered that the Minnesota Department of Education had expanded the parameters of what the money could be used for. "It's not a long-term source of funding, but it will alleviate the cost for our participants' families for a season," Brandt said.

Activities Director, Samantha Lyon, commented that it will be an opportunity for students who have been wanting to try an activity. "This funding will eliminate one more barrier for students to get involved in activities. I hope students and families will take advantage of that opportunity!"

Lyon instructs students and families to register for activities like normal on the school website, and that registration will still be required to participate. If you have already paid for a spring activity, you will be refunded your fee.

They then go station to station seeing what average bills they can expect and then find out if they will have any money left at the end of the month. I think our local businesses do a great job of giving our students a look at what life will be like when they are in charge of their own finances and many students find out that life is really much more involved than they ever thought. We have had very good input from the students about the event and look forward to keeping it an annual event at the school. We plan to expand it to 10th and 12th grade segments next year. 

The Citizens' Forum will be an agenda item during the Board's working session that is scheduled from 6:00 - 7:00 PM prior to the Board's regular monthly meeting.

PROCEDURE FOR CITIZENS' FORUM:

To speak during the Citizens' Forum, the citizen must sign up 15 minutes prior to the start of the meeting by completing a Citizens' Forum Request Form. These forms will be found at a table near the entrance inside the boardroom. Each citizen has five (5) minutes to speak to the Board. If there are multiple requests on the same topic the Board Chair may request one spokesperson to speak on the topic. The Board Chair will review all request forms prior to the meeting, and if approved, will invite citizens to come forward and speak at the prescribed time. The School Board will listen to the citizen and will not be obligated to respond in any way.


Early Childhood Screening

REMINDER to PARENTS of 3-5year-olds: Early Childhood Screening will be held in the Spring of 2023. If you have not received information on screening by the end of April 2023, your child may not be registered on the census so please call the school.

Minnesota Law requires documentation of Early Childhood Screening prior to enrollment in kindergarten. Screening is an early look at a child's development and is conducted by qualified professionals to

help identify specific needs a child may have in these areas: Fine and Gross Motor Skills; Speech and Language Development; Cognitive and Social Development; Vision and Hearing; Height and Weight; and Immunizations. This screening should be completed at least one year before the child enters kindergarten. This service is provided at no cost to the family for all children who reside within Lake of the Woods School District boundaries.



Your school-age children may qualify for certain rights and protections under the federal McKinney-Vento Act.

Your eligible children have the right to:

· Receive a free, appropriate public education.

- Enroll in school immediately, even if lacking documents normally required for enrollment.
- · Enroll in school and attend classes while the school gathers needed documents.
- Enroll in the local school; or continue attending their school of origin (the school they attended when permanently housed or the school in which they were last enrolled), if that is your preference and is feasible.
 - * If the school district believes that the school you select is not in the best interest of your children, then the district must provide you with a written explanation of its position and inform you of your right to appeal its decision.
- · Receive transportation to and from the school of origin, if you request this.
- Receive educational services comparable to those provided to other students, according to your children's needs.

If you believe your children may be eligible, contact the local liaison to find out what services and supports may be available. There also may be supports available for your preschool-age children.



Flu symptom screening tool for parents and caregivers

Use this questionnaire, from the Minnesota Department of Health, each day your child is sick with Influenzalike symptoms and follow the instructions for when to keep the child home and what to tell the child's school.

Does your child have:

1. Fever of 100° F or higher? Yes or No (Take the child's temperature before giving him/ her fever-reducing medicine, like Tylenol.)

Sore throat? Yes or No Cough? Yes or No

Should I keep my child home?


If you checked "yes" for fever AND one of the other symptoms, keep your child home for at least 24 hours after his or her fever is gone without fever-reducing medicine. For many children this will be 5 to 7 days. Your child should feel well enough to participate in school before returning. If you have questions about your child's health or symptoms, call your child's medical provider or clinic.

If your child has been diagnosed by their medical provider with a different disease, such as strep, follow your medical provider's recommendation for when to return to school and call the school nurse to check on the school policy.

What should I tell my child's school?

If you checked "yes" for fever AND one of the other symptoms, tell the school that your child is home with influenza-like illness.
