Elementary Opens New STEAM Learning Lab

Lake of the Woods 5th grade teachers Andreana Nylander & Jeni Krause held the grand opening of our new STEAM Lab during National STEM Week!

What is STEAM?

This acronym stands for Science, Technoloy, Engineering, Arts and Math. Our new Elementary STEAM Lab is a specific learning "MakerSpace" area designed for youngsters to explore with a hands-on approach to all of these engineering concepts. It allows our elementary students to have their own space to think creatively, promotes their critical thinking skills, which leads them to problem solving.

Our STEAM Lab's grand opening for elementary teachers and students took place on November 8, 2024 with a ribbon cutting ceremony. Krause and Nylander worked together previously to create and fill this space with as many consumable supplies as possible. This room is a space for all classroom teachers to take their students to work an any STEAM related activity. These can be open-ended projects, or be presented a real-world problem for the students to solve and work together on.

Healthy Cooking, Healthy Eating

It all started with an amazing donation and kind hearts. Lake-Wood Regional Healthcare Foundation donated \$3,072.48 to a new cooking program in the Highschool. The money was allocated to buy 2 new ranges, a new fridge, a new microwave and many other kitchen supplies. The LakeWood Regional Healthcare Foundation invests in programs and projects that improve the overall health and wellness of the Lake of the Woods County. They prioritize the Community Health Needs. Their mission is to build a healthier Community where we live, work and play.

Jennelle Lowes, staff at Lake of the Woods High School, reached out to Carrie Davidson to inquire about this opportunity. A grant proposal was submitted to the foundation. Our school cooking program's goal is to educate youth regarding healthy cooking and a healthy lifestyle. According to the CDC, 30.7% of Minnesota young adults are considered obese. The students will learn how to prepare well-balanced healthy meals, safety in the kitchen and proper techniques for cooking.

The students have hit the ground running and are loving this opportunity. They select healthy recipes, they make a grocery list, estimate the cost, shop and prepare. So far, they have made French Onion Soup, Corn Chowder, Lasagna and Caesar Salad, muffins, cookies and Taco Salad. Staff are taking advantage of

this opportunity and give a donation towards the meals for sustainability. Staff have donated garden items towards the program.

Other community partnerships have formed with this program. Border Bank donated \$500 in kitchen supplies. Nicole Olson reached out and asked us to make a wish list. The students brainstormed items that they felt would help them learn to cook. Within a week we had so many amazing items. One of the students said, "Ms. Jennelle, it feels like Christmas." Hometown Hardware gave us an excellent price on appliances and delivered and hauled away for free. Ruby's Pantry donates 2 boxes each month to the program. The stu-

dents look at what we have and make a list of what we can cook with all the amazing food. Janice Nelson donated kitchen items as well. An anonymous community member donated several Pampered Chef items as well as other items. We appreciate everything people have done for us. If you would like to learn more or want to donate to our program the students have started another wish list.



STUDs Host Junior High Homecoming Dance





The Citizens' Forum will be an agenda item during the Board's working session that is scheduled from 6:00 - 7:00 PM prior to the Board's regular monthly meeting.

PROCEDURE FOR CITIZENS' FORUM:

To speak during the Citizens' Forum, the citizen must sign up 15 minutes prior to the start of the meeting by completing a Citizens' Forum Request Form. These forms will be found at a table near the entrance inside the boardroom. Each citizen has five (5) minutes to speak to the Board. If there are multiple requests on the same topic the Board Chair may request one spokesperson to speak on the topic. The Board Chair will review all request forms prior to the meeting, and if approved, will invite citizens to come forward and speak at the prescribed time. The School Board will listen to the citizen and will not be obligated to respond in any way.

We meet on the third Wednesday of every month at 5pm in the school commons and all are welcome.





Preschool Registration for 2024-2025 School Year

For future Lake of the Woods school students, there are two "in-school" options for pre-kindergarten school. Please read through these descriptions to see which is the best fit for you and your student and if your student/family qualifies.

School Readiness

Operated and funded through Lake of the Woods School, our School Readiness classroom prepares students for Kindergarten. Class availability will be determined by the application pool with priority offered to students who will be 4-years-old by Sept 1, 2024. Enrollment is determined on a year-by-year basis, based on a number of factors:

- Number of applications
- Ages of applicants
- Funding opportunities

If your student does not qualify for certain types of funding (based on family income, age, etc.), the school may charge a fee for enrollment. Fee schedule is as follows:

Applications are accepted on a rolling basis with enrollment being determined by mid-July. Please contact Diane or Tracy at the school at 218-634-2510 for an enrollment application.

Head Start

Head Start is a federally funded program that is operated by Northwest Community Action, independent from Lake of the Woods School, and runs a classroom in the Lake of the Woods school building. While NWCA and LW School work closely with each other on enrollment, programming, transportation, etc. they are separate programs.

What is ECFE?

Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE) is based on the idea that parents provide their child's first and most significant learning environment. ECFE recognizes that parents are their child's first and foremost teachers. ECFE works to support you as a parent/caregiver and to strengthen and empower families through our weekly or monthly activities. Our goal is to enhance the ability of all parents and other family members to provide the best possible environments for your child's learning along-side you and to support you and your family.


Who Can Participate in ECFE?

ECFE is a parenting education program for all Minnesota families with children between the ages of birth to kindergarten entrance. School districts that have a PreK-Third Grade initiative may offer programming for parents with children even up to third grade; for example: our pre-k thru 3rd grade special community events. In order to continue supporting parent engagement in children's learning and development; we will also offer different activities and events during the year as well.

How is ECFE Offered?

The ECFE program is offered through Minnesota public school districts. Often times in partnership with other community or early learning programs. Learning opportunities through ECFE may occur in a variety of settings, such as within daycares, family's homes, school district or community sites, as well as offering online parenting education and support. Programming and education services often include parents/grandparents/ or other caregivers. ECFE is provided by teachers who are licensed in early childhood and/or parenting education by the state of Minnesota. We are happy to announce that this year, 2024, This program has been working with families across Minnesota for 50 years. INFORMATION FOR PARENTS



IF YOUR FAMILY LIVES IN ANY OF THE FOLLOWING SITUATIONS:

In a shelter

In a motel or campground due to the lack of an alternative adequate accommodation

In a car, park, abandoned building, or bus or train station

Doubled up with other people due to loss of housing or economic hardship

Your school-age children may qualify for certain rights and protections under the federal McKinney-Vento Act.

Your eligible children have the right to:

- · Receive a free, appropriate public education.
- Enroll in school immediately, even if lacking documents normally required for enrollment.
- Enroll in school and attend classes while the school gathers needed documents.
- Enroll in the local school; or continue attending their school of origin (the school they attended when permanently housed or the school in which they were last enrolled), if that is your preference and is feasible.
 - * If the school district believes that the school you select is not in the best interest of your children, then the district must provide you with a written explanation of its position and inform you of your right to appeal its decision.
- · Receive transportation to and from the school of origin, if you request this.
- Receive educational services comparable to those provided to other students, according to your children's needs.

If you believe your children may be eligible, contact the local liaison to find out what services and supports may be available. There also may be supports available for your preschool-age children.






