Monthly Budget Report

Revenue:

- YTD revenues are as follows:
 - State Aid Revenue is 26.8% received
 - o Federal revenues 11.27% received
 - Levy/County Apportionment are 21.5% received
 - Local revenues are 57.8% received
 - o Food Service 21% received
 - Community Education 8% received
 - o Total all Funds 25% \$2,346,472.80
- Grants for 2024-2025
 - o Title 401 \$90,000

Expenditures

Big Picture



Why have a Truth in Taxation Meeting?

- Truth in Taxation Law, passed in 1989 MS 275.065
- Two major requirements:
 - 1. Tax Statements

Counties must send out proposed property tax statements in November based on proposed tax levies set by all taxing jurisdictions (counties, cities, townships, school districts, etc.)

2. Public Hearing

Most taxing jurisdictions must hold a public hearing prior to certifying the final levy and discuss:

- Payable 2025 levy
- Fiscal year 2025 budget
- Public comments

This is the school district's annual required hearing



Who sets the School Levy?

Components of a District Tax Levy are either:

- State Formula Set By Legislature
 - General Education Formula, Operating Capital, Career & Technical, Reemployment, etc.
- Voter Approved as Authorized by the State
 - Operating Referendum or Building Bonds



How is my property tax determined?

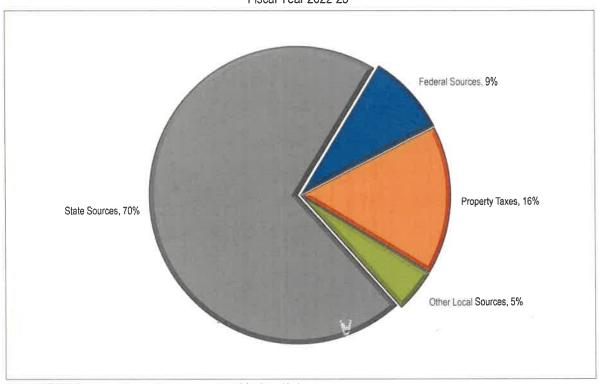
- County Assessor determines market value for each parcel of property.
- MN Legislature sets formulas for Tax Capacity. These formulas determine how the tax burden is split on different types of property (residential, commercial, ag, etc.).
- County Auditor calculates the tax capacity for each parcel based on the above.
- County Auditor divides the total levy by total tax capacity of the District to determine tax rate needed. Tax rate is multiplied by each property's tax capacity*.
- *Certain levies are spread based on Market Value rather than tax capacity.

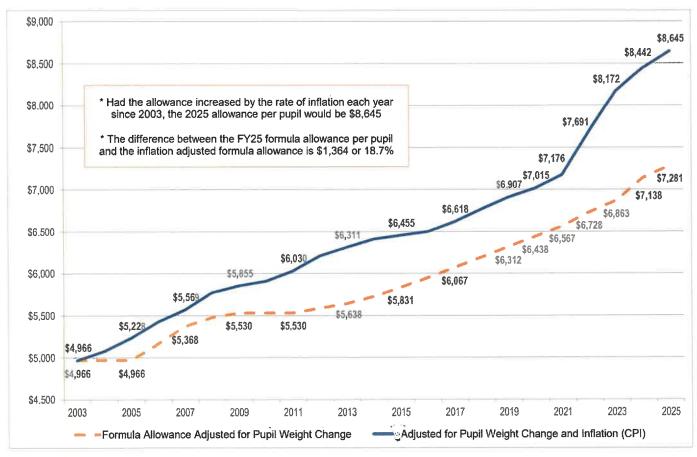




Funding will trail inflation by \$1,364 per pupil in FY25

Adjusted for Pupil Weight Change and Inflation (CPI)



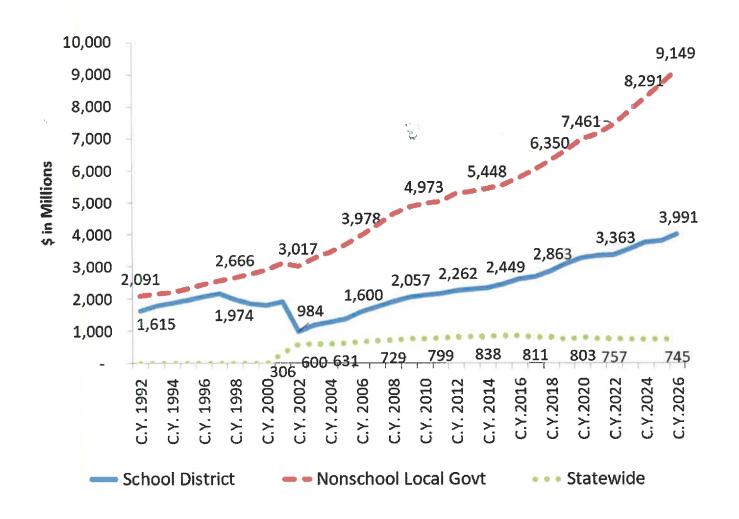

Ag2School Tax Credit

- Permanent law enacted in 2017
- Affects all existing Fund 7 debt levies, except
 OPEB bonds
- Reductions for farmers and timber owners
- •Will remain at 70% in 2025
- •The revenue for Ag2School comes from state income, sales and other tax revenue

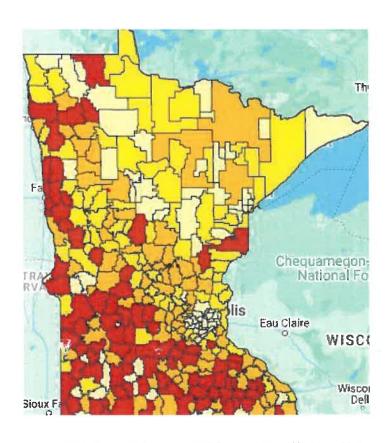

How does our district compare in Operating Referendum Revenue?

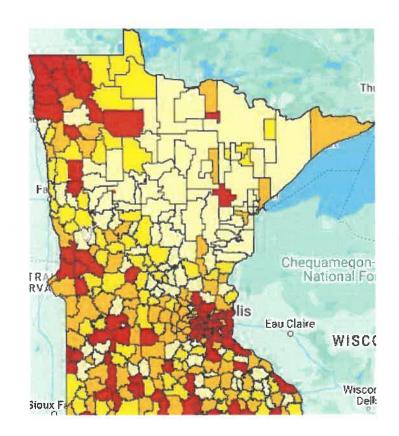

How does our district compare in Referendum Market Value per Residential Pupil Unit?

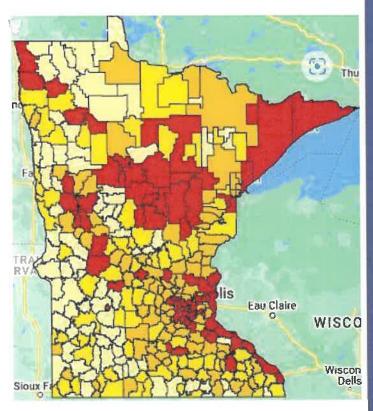

Lake of the Woods School Board Report Jeff Nelson, Superintendent & Building/Grounds December 16, 2024

1.0 Enrollment for December 2, 2024:

- 1.1 422 total enrollment for K-12
 - 1.1.1 <u>Elementary K-5 Total 196:</u> K @ 35, 1st @ 27 -1, 2nd @ 39, 3rd @ 38 +1, 4th @ 24. 5th @ 33
 - 1.1.2 <u>Sr. & Jr. High School 6-12 Total: 226</u> 6th @ 36, 7th @ 33, **8th** @ **35** +1, **9th** @ **26** +1, 10th @ 28, **11th** @ **33** -1, 12th @ 35

2.0 Staffing Update

- 2.1 We had a custodian take a fall and suffer a broken hip. It is undetermined how long this person will be out. It could be anywhere from 1-3 months. The following changes have been made to cover our custodial and maintenance needs:
 - 2.1.1 Nelsons at CNC will resume doing the AM sidewalk checks and sanding like previous years.
 - 2.1.2 We are recommending that JD will go full-time -- He will not do the snow removal/sanding, but will be part-time custodial 4-6 hours at his current rate of \$19.83 (B6) and 2-4 hours as assistant bus mechanic at \$20.07 (B6MA).
 - 2.1.3 We anticipate some additional costs, but it will be determined by a number of variables such as when or if the person can return to part or full-time work and how the weather will impact our snow removal costs. We are consolidating 1.5 FTE into 1.0 FTE so we are hoping to be close to cost-neutral.

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3.0 Referendum Review Meeting

- On Tuesday, December 9 we had a Referendum Review Meeting with representatives from Kraus Anduerson. This first meeting was an informal discussion about the vote on our referendum questions. How we got there; what, if any feedback from the community we've had since the vote; and what might be the Board's appetite for going back to the voters with another effort and when.
- 3.2 I am recommending that we schedule a board workshop with Kraus Anderson in early February to continue this conversation with the new board and begin the process of addressing our financial and facility needs.

4.0 Organizational Meeting

Due to travel conflicts and ensuring that all board members can be in attendance, I am recommending that we tentatively set the meeting date for Tuesday, January 21st at 5:30 PM in the ITV room. If there are additional conflicts, we can reschedule - but need to keep the 3 day public notice in mind when scheduling board meetings.
